Last week, we had the pleasure of hosting the CSUS team, featuring Melissa Sydenham and David Hobson, who collaborated with our Principal, Kylie Burns, and APC&I, Melissa Bryant. During their visit, they engaged in meaningful discussions about data analysis and its implications for our school's strategies and improvements. This opportunity for professional exchange was invaluable in enhancing our approach to data-driven decision-making and fostering a culture of continuous growth within our school community.
